The area stretches from Township Road 412 in the north, Highway 42 in the south, Range Road 240 in the east and Range Road 10 in the west. The jurisdiction encompasses the communities of Blackfalds, Tees, Clive, Joffre, Haynes, Gull Lake, Gasoline Alley, and Springbrook.

April 28th, 2026 to May 4th, 2026

News

The Blackfalds RCMP Detachment received 154 calls for service during the week of April 28th, 2026, to May 4th, 2026. These calls included 2 Arsons to Motor Vehicles, 4 Assaults, 3 Breach of Peace, 2 Break and Enters, 1 Criminal Harassment, 1 Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle, 1 Fraud, 3 Mischiefs, 3 Operation of a Motor Vehicle while Impaired, 2 Thefts, 1 Resist/Obstruct a Peace Officer, and 14 Motor Vehicle Collisions.

April 28, 2026

- One male was charged with Failing to Comply with an Undertaking and Breach of an Emergency Protection Order in Lacombe County.
- Police attended the call of an erratic male at a motel in Gasoline Alley. It was also determined that the male had outstanding warrants. He was arrested and transported to cells and additionally charged with Obstruct Lawful Execution Process. A JIR hearing was conducted and he was remanded.

April 29, 2026

- It was reported that someone had entered a yard at a residence in Red Deer County and smashed out the windows of two vehicles.
- A call was received of a dispute at a residence in Blackfalds. Police attended and mediated the situation.

April 30, 2026

- Police attended the call of an unwanted female sleeping in a cemetery in Red Deer County. The female was provided a ride to another location.
- A call was received of an erratic driver in Red Deer County. Police made patrols and determined the vehicle had been intercepted by Red Deer RCMP.

May 1, 2026

- A call was received of a 2-vehicle collision in Blackfalds, and it was reported that 4 individuals involved in the collision were fighting. Police attended and one male was arrested and charged for Assault and Operating a Vehicle Dangerously. One female was charged with Assault with a Weapon, and Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose. They were both released on Undertakings with conditions.
- Police attended the call that a group of individuals were causing a disturbance at a community use area in Red Deer County. They were advised to depart the area and did so without incident.

May 2, 2026

- It was reported that a male in Lacombe County was breaching the conditions of an Undertaking. The matter is under investigation.
- Police are investigating the complaint of a break and enter to a garage at a residence in Lacombe County. An SUV and 2 generators were stolen and have not yet been recovered.
- It was reported that an Assault had occurred in Red Deer County. The matter is under investigation.

May 3, 2026

- Police located a vehicle stopped in the entryway to the detachment, and the driver appeared unconscious. The driver was woken and after multiple attempts the driver could not provide proper breath samples. An IRS Suspension was issued, the vehicle was towed, and the individual was lodged in cells until sober.
- While on patrol Police noticed a vehicle speeding in a construction zone. A roadside stop was conducted, and the male driver provided two breath samples which resulted in "Fail" readings. An IRS Suspension was issued and the vehicle was towed.

May 4, 2026

- Fire requested Police assistance with a vehicle on fire in Red Deer County that had also caused a grass fire. The incident is under investigation for arson.
- Multiple calls were received of a single vehicle collision in Lacombe County. The driver did not sustain any injuries but was impaired by alcohol. He provided two breath samples which resulted in "Fail" readings. He was issued an IRS Suspension and the vehicle was towed.
- A call was received that another burnt-out vehicle had been located in Lacombe County by a passerby. The matter is under investigation.
